Course Overview:

The term "Bratachari" is derived from two words: "Brata" meaning a vow or pledge, and "Chari" meaning one who practices. Bratachari is a cultural and educational movement that originated in Bengal (now part of India and Bangladesh) in the early 20th century. It was founded by Gurusaday Dutt, a prominent Bengali social worker and folklorist. The Bratachari training course aims to revive and promote Indian cultural heritage, especially through physical education, dance, and other traditional arts.
